Latest updates

Crimes and incidents of interest 1st August to 31st August 2017

Sutton St Nicholas/Marden/Moreton on Lugg

Sutton St Nicholas. Report of suspicious males driving white Toyota pick-up on 22nd August at approx 11:20. The vehicle drove onto a private small holding and occupants enquired about scrap metal and quad bikes. No vehicle registration obtained.

Moreton-on-Lugg. Report of 2 males on unauthorised motorbikes riding in an anti-social manner on private land. SNT have received written confirmation from the land owner that **'NO PERMISSION is given for any access on foot or by vehicle, other than for employees or persons working on behalf of the farm, except along the bridleway that runs from the village road towards Lyde via**

the sewage works; which is also prohibited to vehicles.' This notice has been issued to the 2 males. Both have been advised that members of the community are urged to call police immediately if anyone is seen riding a motorised bike which is believed to be unauthorised for road use, on private land or the highway.

Dormington/Mordiford/Fownhope/Tarrington/Stoke Edith/Hampton Bishop

Fownhope. In the area of Capler, between 09:15 and 17:10 on 2nd August, person(s) unknown have approached the victim's garden and stolen 2 long troughs, a square trough and a pot containing an olive tree.

Tarrington. Between 08:15 and 08:45 on 18th August, victim parked their work vehicle in School Road, Tarrington. The owner of the vehicle was walking back and forth whilst transporting equipment to a nearby property. During this time, without the victim's knowledge, person(s) unknown have taken a number of Bosch and Makita power tools whilst the vehicle was insecure.

Little Tarrington. Between 13:15 and 17:00 on 29th August, victim has discovered theft of lawnmower and power tools from secure shed.

Credenhill/Breinton/Stretton Sugwas/Swainshill/Bishopstone

Breinton. Victim had parked their vehicle overnight in Breinton Springs car park between 17th and 18th August. When returning to vehicle it was discovered that all 4 tyres had been slashed by unknown implement.

Burghill/Tillington/Brinsop

Burghill. Between 15th June and 15th August, victim has discovered theft of Lely Haymax hay making machinery. Item was kept in an outbuilding within rural agricultural premises.

Brinsop. Between 8th and 9th August offender(s) have approached a wooden summer house, which was broken into in May '17. The structure had been strengthened with new locks and bolts and had passive infrared in place. Unknown method used to force the door open and disable the padlocks. Entry gained to remove and steal some binoculars and ceramic items, as done previously.

Bishopstone. Between 18:30 and 23:20 on 27th August; resident of Orchard Close has found damage caused to fence posts, including one post being snapped and others pushed into garden.

Holmer/Lyde/Munstone

Lyde. Between 3rd and 4th August, theft of White YAMAHA Jog, vrm GU12WHC two wheeled moped whilst parked on residential driveway.

Munstone. Between 13th and 14th of August, victim has reported theft of two sets of rattan garden chairs and tables.

Bartestree/Lugwardine/Westhide/Withington/Whitestone/Western Beggard/Preston on Wynne

Lugwardine. Between 14th and 15th August theft of 7-8 vehicle batteries from within a secure outbuilding on the outskirts of Lugwardine.

Western Beggard between 11th and 12th August person(s) unknown have made their way to a small residential holding located along country lane in rural area. Offender(s) have entered a large outbuilding which is split into open and enclosed barns, garages and sheds. A search of 2 sheds and 2 open sided garages carried out and property within stolen. Items stolen consist of farm machinery, lawnmowers and power tools. Padlocks have been abandoned / discarded elsewhere on site.

Western Beggard. Vehicle AF53LSL white Ford Ranger seen acting suspiciously in residential area where recent thefts have taken place. Last reported sighting 18th August at approx 13:30.

Bartestree. Between 11th and 19th August a residential burglary has taken place in Hopton Close, Bartestree. Items of jewellery and cash were taken. Entry gained by unknown offender(s) by forced entry to porch door. Access also gained to 2 wooden sheds at the rear of property where various hand tools were removed; likely used for forcing the door open.

Canon Pyon/Kings Pyon/Westhope/Wellington

Westhope. Suspicious incident discovered on 25th August when the owner of a field found the gate which secures horses inside, had been lifted entirely from its hinges. The heavy gate was found

inside the field. The incident caused 2 of the horses to escape but thankfully no further incidents occurred as a result.

Wellington. At approx 12:30 on 28th August, suspicious vehicle YC58ZNS white Ford Transit van seen in long private driveway. Occupants quickly left the area upon seeing resident.
